- Headache.

Prevention



Wash your hands with soap or an alcohol-based hand sanitizer.



Meat should be cooked thoroughly before eating.



Avoid direct contact with infected people and animals.



Wear a mask and personal protective equipment when taking care for infected people.



Regularly clean utensils, surfaces and personal belongings.



Actively contact medical facilities if there are suspicious symptoms.



Isolate the infected person until they are cured.
